



- Other devices or programs which connect to your laptop or desktop @home or bedside








Teleconferencing Tips

- test all equipment in advance

- don't use red

















Think of yourself as a politician...assume that your microphone is always ON.






microphones

- Just one open microphone can make or break the conversation or crash a good time!











