Stay tuned next month for announcements on some new MSRGN team members who will be joining us as we bid farewell to Cody Price.




Check out the NEW and IMPROVED State Team Webpages!

Arizona Genetic Counselor SURVEY!

You are invited to participate in a research study exploring genetic counselor outreach being conducted by Emily Green, a graduate student at the University of Arizona Genetic Counseling Program. The goals of this study are to (1) gather data on the different types of outreach activities genetic counselors are involved in and (2) identify motivations and barriers experienced by genetic counselors when engaged in outreach. All genetic counselors and genetic counseling students in the United States and Canada are eligible to participate in this study.
