

Check out the State Team highlights and accomplishments


and State Team <u>awards</u> presented at the meeting.

Cross-Pollination Funding Opportunity Applications OPEN!

For the last few years we have heard from our stakeholders that many of you would like to interact more, learn more, and connect more with individuals from other states in our region!

We have HEARD you and created the CROSS-POLLINATION funding opportunity!

For year 6 of the grant cycle, this NEW funding opportunity is available for

ANYONE in the mountain states region (AZ, CO, MT, NV, NM, TX, UT, WY) who has an idea they would like to submit which improves access to genetics services. This funding opportunity will prioritize submissions where individuals from 2 or more of the states in our region are collaborating together on a project...

since the focus is cross-pollination in our region!

The application opens on July 1, 2022 and can be found here. The deadline to submit the application is September 30, 2022.

You do NOT need to be a state team member to apply, however all individuals in our region (including state team members) are encouraged to apply if you have a project idea to improve access to genetics services in MSRGN.

This funding is separate from state team funding, so please utilize the state team funding application for any state team specific project requests first.
