



The Texas team purchased \$200 in postcard stamp postage to mail the postcards they planned to design in year






### Year 5: 2021-2022

The Texas team paid a public health student intern to work on compiling an Excel spreadsheet of addresses for primary care offices in Texas.




The Texas team had plans for a large Facebook advertising campaign in Year 5, which they are still working on and will perhaps pick back up in
