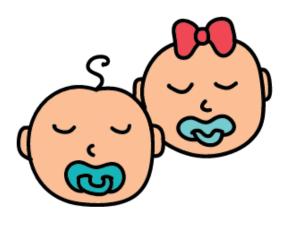
What is Newborn Screening?

"Newborn screening (NBS) includes a series of tests: <u>Blood</u>
<u>Spot Screening</u>, <u>Pulse Oximetry Screening for critical</u>
<u>congenital heart disease</u>, and <u>Hearing Screening</u>.

However, it is more than only these tests. NBS is an interconnected system of organizations, programs, and experts who work together to make sure that caregivers and health professionals have information they need to understand NBS and know where to find more information when needed."

The ACMG ACT Sheets and their accompanying algorithms are a great resources for health care providers looking for information on genetic conditions (identified through newborn screening and beyond) to help inform clinical decision making.

For each marker(s), there is 1) an ACTion (ACT) sheet that describes the short term actions a health professional should follow in communicating with the family and determining the appropriate steps in the follow-up of the infant that has screened positive, and 2) an algorithm that presents an overview of the basic steps involved in determining the final diagnosis in the infant.
