Colorado Transition Resources: Layers of Life

Resources for individuals & families with disabilities or a genetic diagnosis as they navigate the challenging transitions that occur throughout the lifespan.



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Intern and Mailers

The Colorado team paid a high school intern to help finish up the subtext for the cake project and a prospective genetic counseling student to contact clinics and mail 40 boxes (with magnets, "Where is Bear?", rack cards, redflags and GN bios) to pediatric clinics and CCB's in Colorado.

Year 7: 2023-2024

Going into grant year 7 the team plans on using their funds to pay an intern for follow up on their year 6 project and to spread awareness about the Colorado Transition Resources: Layers of Life.

Intern & Pop Ups

The Colorado team plans to pay a genetic counseling student intern to follow up with and gather feedback from the pediatrician offices and early intervention departments of the Community Center Boards that were sent resources and contacted in grant years 5 and 6. The remaining funds will cover shipping and printing costs to provide requested resources. The team also plans to hold a Genetics "Pop-Up" focused on awareness and how to use the Colorado Transition Resources: Layers of Life resource.



Time 4 Genetics

The Colorado team recruited 3 clinics to the Time 4 Genetics Initiative to educate primary care providers in their state.
